





# International Foundation Year in business

The International Foundation Year in Business is a one-year pathway designed to prepare international students for first year entry to an undergraduate degree course at university in the UK or abroad.

## Who is this pathway for?

This pathway course is particularly suited to those seeking a career in business, finance, and management.

Carefully designed to prepare you for undergraduate study at a university of your choice, this course will strengthen your English language and academic skills as well as develop subject specific knowledge in Business topics such as Marketing and HR.

By successfully completing one of our courses, you are guaranteed access to one of the many NCUK Guaranteed Universities. In addition to these universities, many students have gone onto study at a number of other institutions in the UK and worldwide.

## Academic Modules

There are three academic modules designed to prepare you for the study of Business, Finance or Management at undergraduate degree level. Additionally, you will also study a module in English for Academic Purposes.

### Mathematics (Business)

This module introduces fundamental mathematical topics and concepts that are required in a range of business subjects studied at degree level. Students will have an introduction to key knowledge, understanding, skills and application of mathematics.

### Business Studies

The aim is to ensure that students have a solid grounding in business studies and feel confident in commencing the study of business-related courses at undergraduate level. May include the following topics: marketing, accounting and finance, HR and business and the legal environment.

### Economics

The overall aim of this module is to introduce the basic economic concepts and principles. Reference is mainly to the UK experience in preparation for studying with British students at university. This module may cover a wide range of micro and macro economics.

### English for Academic Purposes\*

This module gives you an English qualification that is recognised by universities and can be used for visa purposes. The module aims to give you the academic English language skills needed for university as well as improving your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills.

Please note: The English for Academic Purposes is for non-native speakers of English.

# Pre-Master's Preparation course

The Pre-Master's course will give you guaranteed progression to one of many available master's degrees at leading universities across the UK and abroad reducing the stress of applying to each university separately, giving you the confidence to get on with your studies.

## Who is this pathway for?

The Master's Preparation course will improve your English language, academic study skills, and experience of working in a project group and give you the opportunity to complete a 5,000 word dissertation.

Being able to formally undertake a practice dissertation before starting your master's degree gives you the chance to understand what is required whilst also improving your research and academic writing.

Depending on your English language level, you will either study our Master's Preparation over 10 or 20 weeks.

This course will fully prepare you for a master's degree at a UK, Australian or New Zealand University and will equip you with the key tools to succeed first time.

## Academic Modules

There are two academic modules designed to prepare you for the study at postgraduate degree level.

### Research Methods

The overarching aim of the Research Methods module is to allow students to develop their academic study skills to the level required to successfully embark on a postgraduate course at university. This will be done through the exploration of research methods and a research project.

### English for Academic Purposes

This module is designed for students who are not proficient English speakers and who do not have a Secure English Language Test (SELT) that is acceptable for entry under- and/or postgraduate programmes.

The aim of the EAP module is to allow students to develop their English language and academic skills to the level required to successfully study their chosen degree course in English. The EAP module, therefore, introduces students to the linguistic demands of undergraduate study, including independent reading and study, extended writing and accessing academic texts.







# What will you study?

During the IFD pathway, you will study modules that are core to your subject area and others designed to develop the required skills and knowledge to successfully study at university level.

## Modules

### Introduction to Accounting and Finance 1

The aims of this module are to introduce students to the basic mechanics and processes of financial accounting in both theory and practice and so prepare them for degree studies in business subjects.

### Digital Literacy

This module enables students to enhance their basic IT skills and further develop research skills through the appropriate use of the Internet.

### Data Analysis

The overall aim of this module is to enable students to apply data to work towards solutions of real-life problems in the contexts of their chosen field of further study. To achieve this, students are introduced to basic statistical concepts, topics and methods. They are also introduced to statistical packages to help them collate and present data in forms that help them analyse and interpret it effectively.

### Business Functions

The overall aim of this module is to provide students with a basic introduction to the study of business and management by introducing them to the standard departments within a business, such as finance, marketing and human resource management.

### International Business Management

This module looks at business structure and the impact of internal and external factors on business growth and development. It introduces students to approaches to management and leadership within businesses and how thinking about management has developed over time.

### Introduction to Economics

This module aims to provide students with a basic introduction to the study of Macro and Microeconomics, introducing them to relevant economic theories, concepts and terminology and to explain the importance of key topics such as demand and supply, the economic problem, the allocation of scarce resources and ideas around elasticity, specialisation, productivity, economies of scale and monopoly.

### Project Study

This module aims to introduce students to the skills required to plan, research, prepare for, write up and deliver a project within their subject area. They have the opportunity to study all aspects of a project related to their particular field of study and to identify and develop a range of skills to enable them to realise the project, from the original concept, the research methods most suited to the topic chosen.

### UK Government and Society

The aims of the module are to provide students with a basic introduction to government and society in the British Isles, including a historical element showing briefly how Britain has changed and developed since 1945. The module further aims to consider external pressure on government – lobbyists, pressure groups, NGOs and the role of the media and, in its concluding weeks, to consider in summing up the state of British democracy in the early 21st century and how Britain relates to, influences and is influenced by the wider world. social and environmental impact and sustainability (depending on the subject area) and reporting their findings both in written form and through a presentation.

## VISA INFORMATION FOR INTERNATIONAL AND EU STUDENTS

If you are a EU/EEA/Swiss national, and you will come to the UK to study a full-time programme for more than six months, or you are extending your stay to complete your studies, you will need to apply for a Student route visa.

The new Student Route Visa immigration system was implemented 1st January 2021. The Student route opened at 9 a.m. on 5 October 2020 for applications made outside the UK only from EEA nationals coming to the UK from 1 January 2021 to study a course which meets the requirements of the route.
